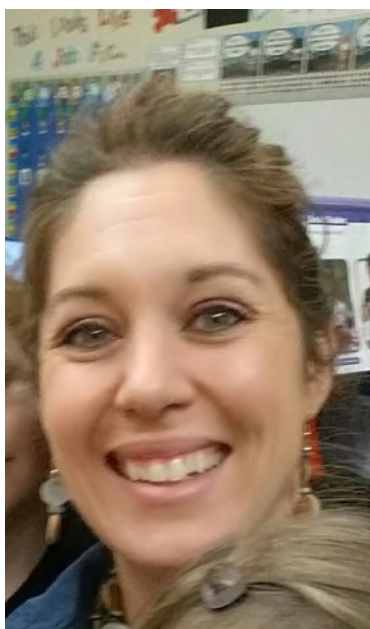




The teacher who started it all



April Dunnehoo is the teacher in southwest Louisiana featured in Tina Marks' short story, *MNRI® in the Classroom* in the new book, *Reflexes: Portal to Neurodevelopment and Learning*.

April was initially introduced to MNRI® when she walked into Tina's speech therapy session and was surprised to see Tina working on the student's feet! Her interest was sparked immediately. Within a few weeks she attended her first MNRI® workshop and immediately knew the potential and impact this could have on the students in her classroom.

Through discussions with other local therapists and with the permission from her principal, she spent the last six weeks in her classroom that year implementing the MNRI® Archetype DVD and several reflex patterns. The results were quite amazing – from changes in behavior to handwriting – in a very challenged group of children. That summer, she worked with the therapists and Dr. Patty Shackelford to coordinate the first *Maximizing Brain Potential* workshop, intended to help other teachers implement the Archetypes and reflex patterns in their classrooms.

The next year, she used the Archetype DVD and reflex patterns to transform her classroom. Several low functioning students who were charted for special education evaluations, no longer qualified for services after the first six weeks of implementation. Low readers gained the skills and confidence to become good readers. By the end of the year, her classroom's DIBELS scores (a reading placement indicator) showed the most growth in the whole parish – from the lowest scores in the beginning, to the highest at year end.

April now teaches in a Reverse Mainstream special education preschool classroom where her students also have shown great growth in speech and processing skills. She has presented her ideas and implementation at her local school with her fellow teachers, and has championed her ideas and experiences with over 150 educators on the state level at APEL (Association of Professional Educators of Louisiana) conferences two summers in a row to packed rooms of attendees.

We thank April for her vision in seeing the potential of this program for her students! This vision continues to impact more and more students and teachers in Louisiana (see article below) and elsewhere.

Maximizing class full in Louisiana

On July 24-25, a *Maximizing Your Brain Potential* class was held at the Leonville Elementary School in Leonville, LA. Thirty-seven people attended including 2 Principals, 2 School



Administrators, several Teachers, a Parent, Speech Therapists, Occupational Therapists, Mental Health Counselors, a Behavior Interventionist, and an Educational Diagnostician. They represented schools from 5 parishes (counties) in Louisiana.

The large attendance from a broad area is a result of Tina Marks, Lisa Ortego, Emily Pelican, and Laurie Callaba initiating MNRI® Archetypes in classrooms in their schools in Allen Parish and Jeff Davis Parish in Louisiana. Teacher April Dunnehoo (see story above) received such amazing results and gave presentations about this which has spread the word throughout Louisiana.

Some of the feedback by class attendees were: "I have used this in my class last year and I saw big changes in the students." "I know now how to calm myself and feel safe. My children will feel safer, as well." "My left knee is better. I am bearing weight and walking better. I also have a plan to go home and start helping my son and myself. The personal stories and testimonies along with your knowledge was great! Thank you Dr. Patty!" "You have suggestions for kids that NO one else had suggestions for." "I feel empowered with information." "It was such an amazing experience. . . the most important training I have ever been to." "I just learned so much about how the brain is supposed to work." Some have expressed interest in creating studies for possible publication.

The class was taught by Core Specialists, Dr. Patty Shackleford, Tina Marks, and Lisa Ortego. By the end of the class, those attending were asking for it to be offered again in Louisiana.

What happens at the 8 am. meeting?

As a parent, I always wondered what occurred in the 8 am. meeting held each morning at the Family Conferences with Dr. Masgutova and her specialists.

At the Minneapolis Family Conference, I attended it each morning.



Dr. Masgutova starts the meeting by Archetype stretching movements (if time allows), then talks about what may have happened yesterday and what, if anything must be done to help. She then discusses any events that will be happening during the day (anything unusual happening? what time is the graduation ceremony that day?).

At each meeting, Dr. Masgutova demonstrates a technique – adding enrichment and refinement to the steps (like Hands Supporting), or it can be something like a new approach to Grounding. She will mention which kids might best benefit by receiving these steps. She often adds a story or two about using the technique – how it was developed or the successes she saw.

One day we celebrated with the new Core Specialists who had passed tests that previous evening to become certified.

She leads discussions of special needs of the kids, such as, is there a child with sound sensitivity issues who needs different location?

So the meetings are a little education, a little team building, and a little housekeeping – all rolled into 45 minutes.

MNRI taught in Egypt



Diane Whiteside, Core Specialist and Certified Instructor for MNRI®, taught one of the first classes in Egypt in May organized by Hoda Ellackany, an MNRI® parent and student. The group of students came from vast distances with differences in culture, educational backgrounds, and professions. Thirty-six (36%) were mothers of special needs children (3

were medical doctors), 4 were physiotherapists, 14 were speech therapists, 1 was a physical education teacher, 1 was a special education teacher, and 1 was an art therapist. One student came from Lebanon, one from Palestine, and one from Oman.

MNRI® brought together people of different national, cultural, and religious backgrounds in order to share knowledge to enrich the lives of their children.

upstairs balcony overlooks the bricked drive and yard.

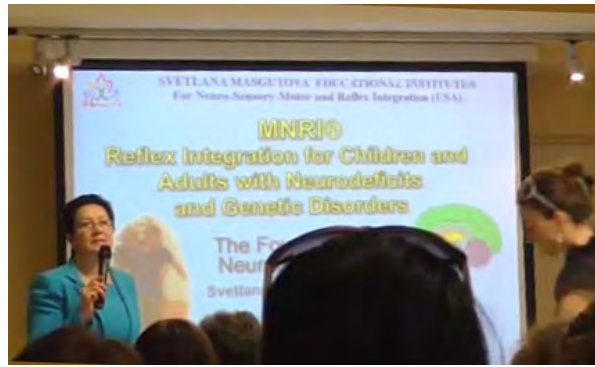
There is a kitchen upstairs as well as many large windows which keep the rooms light and airy.
